

# OUR RECENT MILESTONES Raising Awareness Results in Successes

# CHANGE.ORG CAMPAIGN

In 2016-2017 Meningitis Centre Australia lobbied the Western Australian Government to put the ACWY vaccination on to the State Immunisation Plan for 15-19 year olds to stop the increasing rate of the deadly "W" strain of meningococcal disease. This then led to an active push at the end of 2017 and the beginning of 2018 to also get this vaccination on to the State Immunisation Plan and the National Immunisation Plan for those children under the age of 5 years.

**WA Health Minister Roger Cook announced ACWY Vaccine for WA** children aged 1-4years

#### ACWY CAMPAIGN

From July - December 2017 Meningitis Centre Australia took to social media to spread awareness of the FREE ACWY vaccination in Western Australia for 15 to 19 year olds, due to the susceptibility and rise of the deadly disease amongst Australian teens.

# ONGOING WORK

### **WORLD MENINGITIS DAY**

In the lead up to World Meningitis Day on April 24th. each year MCA runs a powerful campaign to advocate the importance of vaccinations against Meningococcal and Meningitis.



- Providing extensive information online regarding vaccinations for Australians and:
- Facilitating an info desk in the heart of Perth CBD to personally communicate these messages with the Western Australian community.
- In 2018, Federal Health Minister Greg Hunt acknowledged the day in a video he prepared for us and was used on social media, and urged people to know the signs and symptoms of the disease.



# **BROCHURES & PAMPHLETS**

Our brochures, fridge magnets and booklets are very popular within the community and thousands of families have our magnets on their fridges across the country. Supporters have brought our pamphlets into doctor's surgeries to request meningococcal vaccinations and the GP's have been so impressed with our material, they have requested thousands of pamphlets and posters for their surgeries across the country.



### SOCIAL MEDIA

In our determination to continually increase vaccinations throughout Australia, we consistently post to our social media pages (min. 3 times per week), and continue to provide information on these vaccine preventable diseases. Additionally, we use our social media presence, to help advocate and instil change in vaccine availability.





# PREGNANCY, BABIES & CHILDREN'S EXPO'S

We started attending the Baby Expos in Perth and were very well received by "expectant parents" and established parents who wanted to know about what we do and the disease itself.



The Centre now actively takes part in more than 5 Pregnancy Babies & Children's Expo's throughout Australia each year. The Expo's are instrumental to our connection with the Australian community, and provide mums and dads with access to important information on Meningococcal & Meningitis vaccinations.

### Como - Singapore Visit

Meningitis Centre Australia is a global influence on the disease and is a leading member of the Confederation of Meningitis Organisations since 2004. In March 2018, the Centre attended, and presented, a paper at the CoMO global conference in Singapore on our ACWY vaccination program and campaign. This conference brings together 45 member organisations from 27 countries.

# HAEMOPHILUS INFLUENZAE TYPE B (Hib)

Through the 'Wipe it Out' campaign, Meningitis Centre alerted parents to Hib and the first meningitis vaccine was added to the NIP. Hib caused 40% of Meningitis cases in Australia.

### MENINGOCOCCAL C

Witnessed the federal health authorities add this important vaccine to the NIP, which was quite prevalent in the eastern states. Meningitis Centre lobbied hard for the Pneumococcal vaccine – the big sister to Meningococcal.

### **PNEUMOCOCCAL**

After 3 years of campaigning, Meningitis Centre met with Health Minister Tony Abbott to discuss the importance of this vaccine, and the government funded \$178 million to add this vaccine to the NIP.

### **ACW-135Y**

"Eliminating Meningococcal is as easy as ABC..WY" petition postcard campaign led to a meeting with WA Health Minister John Day in December 2016 and in January 2017 WA became the first state in Australia to put the vaccine on its immunisation plan for 15-19 year olds, 3 states followed two weeks later.

### **ACW-135Y**

Vaccination program for 1-4 year olds and 15- 19 year olds in WA. The ACW-135Y vaccine was also added to the National Immunisation Plan for 12 month olds.

# MENINGOCOCCAL B IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

South Australia became the first state in the country to put Men B on its State Immunisation Plan. The Centre spent several years in SA getting people to sign petitions and support our "Lobby your MP for the Men B"campaign. Babies and toddlers aged between 6 weeks to 1 year will now be vaccinated against Men B.

### MENINGOCOCCAL B IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

15-20 year old young adults in South Australia will also be vaccinated for free against Meningococcal B.

### **ACW-135Y**

Vaccination program for 14-19 year olds added to the National Immunisation Program, as this group is considered the biggest carriers of the disease.

**OUR CURRENT FIGHT** 

MENINGOCOCCAL PREVENTION, B STRAIN

Meningitis Centre Australia continues to fight for the B strain vaccine to be put on the National Immunisation Plan.

The Centre knows that herd immunity works. Meningococcal B remains the most common form of meningococcal disease and we are urging the Federal Government to put the Men B on to the NIP to protect the most vulnerable, our children.

Through the ongoing support of our Sponsors, Supporters and the Australian community, Meningitis Centre Australia is putting the necessary pressure on Governments to take action against this vaccine preventable disease.
